Deeply attachment with hero / heroin / protagonist / writer.











Anachronism

Definition, something or someone that is not in its correct historical or chronological time.

For example, if a painter paints a portrait of Aristotle, and shows him wearing a wrist watch, it would be an example of anachronism, as we are all aware that wristwatches did not exist during Aristotle's time.







Aposiopesis

It is a rhetorical device that can be defined as a figure of speech in which the speaker or writer breaks off abruptly, and leaves the statement incomplete. It is used of writers of realistic conversation.

Example: I will kill you, I will.... I, I will surely kill you.
