Noun + and Noun → verb (plural verb)

Examples-

⇒ Ram and his father ~~has~~ have come to me.
(N1) (N2)

→ Determiner + Noun + And + Determiner + Noun = Plv
↓ (A/An/The)
(Article + P. case)

Examples-

⇒ The principal and the Manager ~~was~~ were absent.

→ Determiner + Noun + And + Noun → S/V

Examples-

⇒ The principal and Manager ~~is~~ are my friends.

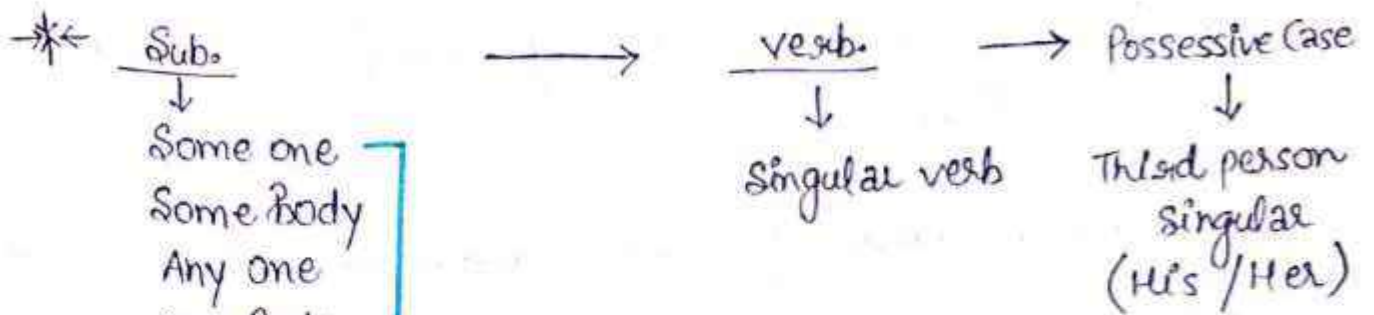
⇒ The Director and the principal ~~is~~ are against me.

⇒ The Director and principal ~~is~~ are against me.

⇒ My father and friend ~~is~~ are with me.

⇒ My uncle and aunt ~~is~~ are with me.

- ⇒ Neither of them ~~was/were~~ with me.

⇒ A large number of boys ~~has~~/have attended my class.

⇒ The number of players ~~has~~/have participated.

* Amount
Time, Distance, Height और weight आदि में से कोई certain unit दर्शाता है, तो verb (निश्चित शक्ति) singular form में होगी—

Examples—

⇒ Ten thousand rupees ~~is~~/~~are~~ a great amount.

⇒ Ten thousand rupees ~~has~~/have been spent.

⇒ Twenty miles ~~is~~/~~are~~ a long distance to walk.
