## Definition

An adverb is a word which qualifies an adjective, an adverb or a verb etc

## Adjective

An Adjective is a word which qualifies a Noun or a Pronoun.



⇒ She is my beautiful wife (Noun)

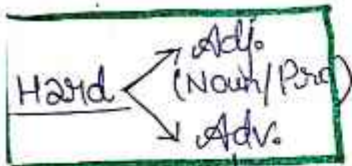
⇒ I work hard [Adverb]

⇒ Come fast to me. [Adverb]

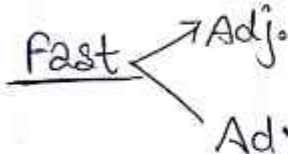
⇒ It's hard work for me.

⇒ Do it quickly. [Adverb]

⇒ Do it very quickly.

- She is ~~so~~ lazy that ~~she cannot~~<sup>to</sup> do it.
  - They are ~~so~~ honest they cannot accept any bribe.
  - The Tiger is ~~so~~ old that he cannot hunt.
  - The Tiger is too old that he cannot hunt.<sup>to</sup> hunt.
- ~~Too + Adj.~~ < that clause X  
 To + VI ✓
- ~~so~~  
~~Too + Adj.~~ < that clause ✓  
 To + VI X
- My grandfather is ~~so~~ old <sup>that he cannot</sup> to walk

(c) so + Adj. के साथ To + VI तो so के स्थान पर Too लिखते हैं।

- She is ~~so~~<sup>too</sup> weak to walk
- He ran ~~so~~<sup>too</sup> fast to be caught up with.
- The lion was ~~so~~<sup>too</sup> weak to run

Rule 2 - Too much and Much too हमें हमेशा याद रखनी चाहिए कि too much के बाद Noun का प्रयोग होता है और much too के बाद Adj. का प्रयोग होता है।

- The journey was <sup>much too</sup> long.
- The task is <sup>much too</sup> difficult to do.
- I have already faced much too difficulty in managing these people
